This 2.5-day workshop will offer an in-depth look at the three branches of Georgia's state government. Activities include tours of the Georgia State Capitol, State Capitol Museum, and Supreme Court of Georgia, as well as presentations by guest speakers and other special events.

Teachers will also collaborate with each other and the staffs of NGE and GALILEO to create digital primary source packages related to the history and functions of Georgia's state government. Some follow-up work to complete the packages will be required after the workshop ends. The packages will be published on the For Educators page of the New Georgia Encyclopedia.
