

Why You Need GALILEO

Web search engines may be a fine way to answer a question in some cases, but they are limited to information that people have made available on websites and may include content that is deliberately misleading, out-of-date, commercial, or simply incomplete and/or unreliable. GALILEO provides Georgians with quality content from books, magazines, and journals (most of which are not freely available via the Web) through a collection of subscription and specially-developed databases.


