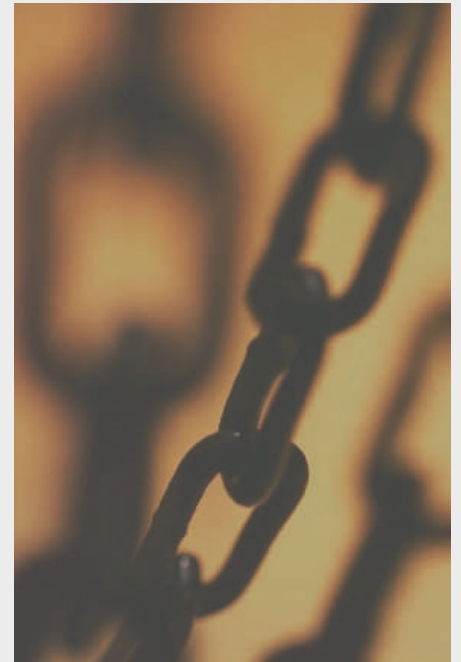
Is your library making the most of GALILEO?
