Vanishing Georgia contains nearly 18,000 photographs documenting more than 100 years of Georgia history and life. These images cover family and business life, street scenes and architecture, agriculture, school and civic activities, landscapes, and important individuals and events in Georgia history among other topics. Between 1975 and 1996, the Georgia Archives duplicated images held by individuals and organizations across the state in an effort to preserve Georgia's historical photographs. The Georgia Archives joins with the Digital Library of Georgia to present the Vanishing Georgia images as a digital resource. Support for the project is provided by a Library Services and Technology Act grant administered through Georgia HomePLACE.

Removal of USG per-search FirstSearch databases

As previously announced, GALILEO has expected that the USG GALILEO institutions' would run out of FirstSearch per-search credits during the fall semester 2003. During the Fall semester, the University System of Georgia was able to secure additional funding to continue access to FirstSearch per-search databases through December 31, 2003. Unfortunately, beginning on January 1, 2004, all remaining FirstSearch per-search databases will be removed from USG institutions' GALILEO menus due to lack of per-search credits. Because several per-search databases were removed from GALILEO menus earlier this week due to a change in OCLC's agreement with the H. W. Wilson Company, only these four databases will be lost on

January 1:

Alternative Press Index BasicBIOSIS EconLit PAIS International

As announced in July, some of the most heavily used FirstSearch databases were replaced with subscription equivalents from EBSCOhost. These include, Agricola, CINAHL, MLA International Bibliography, and PsycFIRST.

USG institutions will continue to have access to FirstSearch's base package of databases, which includes the following: ArticleFirst, ERIC, GPO Monthly Catalog, MEDLINE, OCLC Union List of Periodicals, PapersFirst, ProceedingsFirst, World Almanacs, and WorldCat.

July 1, 2003: Besides the FirstSearch databases that are being replaced by EBSCOhost equivalents for the University System of Georgia, other FirstSearch databases have also been removed from USG institutions' GALILEO menus to conserve the consortium's remaining search credits. Beginning July 2, only the following FirstSearch databases will be accessible to USG until the current pool of search credits is depleted: Alternative Press Index, Applied Science and Technology Index, Art Index, BasicBIOSIS, EconLit, Education Index, Essay and General Literature Index, General Science Index, Library Literature, and PAIS International. At the current rate of searching, we expect access to these databases to continue for one to two months.

This comprehensive series has carefully-written, in-depth articles covering each state's history, averaging 10 pages in length, and includes information on the economy, geography, natural resources, wildlife, state flags and landmarks.

Of special and current interest are the 2-3 page biographies on each state's Governors, Senators and Representatives, as well as other leaders such as Rudolph Giuliani, Noam Chomsky, Ralph Nader, Bill Clinton, and Condoleeza Rice. All records in Our States contain Lexile Reading Levels, and information is updated quarterly.

Later this week, Grove Art Online will be updated with a significant redesign of the site as well as new and revised content.

Redesign

The welcome pages have been redesigned to a cleaner look to bring the product in line with OUP style. There has also been a re-positioning of key elements like title and quick search. Users will also notice that the home page has been reformatted to more closely resemble article view pages, with a main window plus a side bar on the left. Finally, the title of the site has been standardized throughout to Grove Art Online.

Help Features

The user help pages and FAQs have been updated and revised, with links to the access management system pages for improved subscriber services. We have also added a Product Demonstration of the Grove Art Online site. Users who are new to the web site will be able to have a quick tour of the many features available on Grove Art Online and those with general queries about search functions and technical issues will be able to locate answers much more easily.

Content and Images

Delay of new content in ERIC

As a part of the reorganization of the ERIC system, the United States Department of Education has announced that no new materials will be received and accepted for the ERIC database until an unspecified time later in 2004. More information is available at http://www.eric.ed.gov. Further, beginning December 19, 2003, the AskERIC service and the subject specific clearinghouses will be eliminated. It appears documents from the clearinghouses will be added in the interim until the new model is available. GALILEO staff have contacted our vendors of ERIC to find out more about how these changes will be addressed by each vendor. We will pass on information as it becomes available.

Below is a statement published by the Educational Resources Information Center: "Beginning in January and until the new ERIC model for acquiring education literature is developed later in 2004, no new materials will be received and accepted for the database. However, the ERIC database will continue to grow, as thousands of documents selected by the ERIC clearinghouses throughout 2003 will be added. When the new model is ready later in 2004, the new ERIC contractor will communicate with publishers, education organizations, and other database contributors to add publications and materials released from January 2004 forward."

OCLC to distribute CLASE and PERIODICA databases online

The General Directorate for Libraries of the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico (UNAM) has granted OCLC the exclusive right to distribute UNAM's CLASE and PERIODICA databases online through the OCLC FirstSearch service, the online reference service used in more than 21,000 libraries worldwide.

CLASE (Citas Latinoamericanas en Ciencias Sociales y Humanidades) and PERIODICA (Indice de Revistas Latinoamericanas en Ciencias) have been produced by UNAM since the mid-1970s. The databases offer information from articles, essays, book reviews, technical reports, and interviews published in journals edited in 24 different countries of Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as from publications that focus on Pan-American issues.

OCLC will make these databases available as the combined CLASE/ PERIODICA database to subscribers of the OCLC FirstSearch Base Package, a collection of core reference resources available through the online reference service. Library users will be able to search the combined CLASE/PERIODICA database to retrieve citations from both databases, or limit their search results to citations from either the CLASE or PERIODICA database.

CLASE/ PERIODICA will also be offered as a database on FirstSearch that libraries can access either on a per-search or subscription basis. The database will be available on the FirstSearch service beginning in November.

The CLASE/PERIODICA database in FirstSearch will expand OCLC's offerings in Spanish and Portuguese language materials.

CLASE indexes documents published in Latin American and Caribbean journals specializing in social sciences and humanities. PERIODICA covers journals specializing in science and technology. CLASE and PERIODICA offer access to more than 400,000 citations from documents published in 2,800 selected scholarly journals, and have become significant reference resources for those interested in what is published in or about Latin America.

All the original source documents indexed in the CLASE and PERIODICA databases are housed and available at the Hemeroteca Latinoamericana (Latin American Periodicals Library) located at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico. OCLC plans to add a link from records in the CLASE/PERIODICA database to the Web site of UNAM's Document Retrieval Service. Library users will be able to click on this link and order copies of the articles they need directly from UNAM's Document Retrieval Service.

"The addition of the CLASE/PERIODICA database in FirstSearch will not only enhance OCLC services in Latin America and the Caribbean, but it will also offer unique resources to libraries worldwide interested in providing valuable information from this vital region," said Frank Hermes, Vice President, OCLC Cooperative Discovery Services. "This is an excellent opportunity for OCLC to partner with member libraries to increase the visibility of authoritative and high-quality content to library users worldwide."

The addition of MasterFILE Premier to the GALILEO homepage was proposed to and approved by the Georgia Library Media Association earlier this summer. Please note that public libraries, technical colleges, and AMPALS, GPALS, and University System of Georgia institutions will not be affected by this change.

The databases included on the GALILEO Kids' Page (http://kids.galileo.usg.edu) have also changed as of this morning: EBSCOhost's Middle Search Plus database has replaced JuniorQuest. This change affects Kids' Page users in all GALILEO communities.

Despite the loss of ProQuest databases for K-12 schools, we believe that the remaining EBSCOhost databases that are now featured on the GALILEO homepage and Kids' Page will provide access to a similarly wide range of full-text articles for media specialists, teachers, and students of all ages.

ProQuest enhancements in PQNext release

The next release of ProQuest is planned for Sunday, July 20, 2003. PQNext, the name ProQuest has given to this release, shows the results of efforts to make the interface more intuitive and easier to use. Enhancements to the interface include the following:

- * A comprehensive search capability will return complete hit counts automatically.
- * The bibliography print feature will allow users to mark articles, then print a bibliography in their choice of citation styles (AMA, Chicago, MLA, and Turabian).
- * The "Browse Topics" link will provide access to ProQuest's topic tree and controlled vocabulary. This enhancement will allow users to search the vocabulary and add terms to their search with the click of a button.
- * In the results menu, article grouping will sort results by journal type.
- * "My Research Summary" will make it easy to create reading lists and course work.

Earlier in the spring, ProQuest removed the former backfile designations (Current, Backfile, and Deep Backfile). Date range options are available in the advanced search screen.

To install PQNext, ProQuest will take a maintenance window from 10 p.m. Saturday July 19th to 10 a.m. Sunday July 20th. During this time, all ProQuest databases will be unavailable.

Changes in GALILEO Express Links

Because all GPALS, AMPALS, and University System of Georgia institutions are now using an EBSCOhost version of the MLA International Bibliography in place of FirstSearch's interface, any GALILEO Express Links that were created for MLA prior to July 1 are now inactive. If you currently have an Express Link to this database in your browser bookmarks or within your library's website, then please go to GALILEO and create a new Express Link for this database in order to restore access. Alternately, changing the attribute "link=zoml" to "link=zbml" in your existing Express Link URL will also restore access.

For University System of Georgia institutions, the new EBSCOhost versions of PsycINFO, AGRICOLA, and CINAHL pose similar problems. If you created Express Links to FirstSearch's PsycFIRST, AGRICOLA, or CINAHL before July 1, then please return to GALILEO and create new Express Links for these databases. (The few institutions that already received the EBSCOhost version of PsycINFO before July 1 of this year are not affected by this change.) Alternately, you can alter your existing Express Link URLs in the following ways:

AGRICOLA: change "link=zoag" to "link=zbag"

CINAHL: change "link=zocn" to "link=zbcn"

PsvcFIRST/PsvcINFO: change "link=zopf" to "link=zbpv"

Please note that technical colleges, public libraries, and some AMPALS and GPALS institutions still receive AGRICOLA, CINAHL, and PsycFIRST through FirstSearch, and Express Links for these databases at these institutions require no changes.

GALILEO Changes For FY 2004

Beginning July 1, many of you will notice changes in the GALILEO resources available at your institution. Though state budget restrictions caused the GALILEO user communities and the GALILEO Steering Committee to face some difficult decisions for the new fiscal year, we are glad to report that many of the resulting changes are positive ones. Thanks in part to a continuing LSTA grant, every user community will continue to have a rich and varied set of resources through Georgia's Virtual Library this year. Below are descriptions of the current and

upcoming changes, grouped by database vendor.

-EBSCO-

GALILEO's core EBSCOhost databases are available to all communities again this year. EBSCO will introduce an updated search interface later this summer, and some details of the upgrade are currently available at http://support.epnet.com/custsupport/Spotlight/TS_EhostRelease.asp.

AMPALS, GPALS, and University System of Georgia institutions now receive the MLA International Bibliography through EBSCOhost, replacing the FirstSearch version of this database. Through EBSCO's SmartLinks feature, users now have direct access from MLA citations to their corresponding full-text articles in Academic Search Premier.

All University System of Georgia institutions now receive CINAHL, AGRICOLA, and PsycINFO through EBSCOhost, thanks to additional support from the USG leadership. These replace the FirstSearch versions of CINAHL, AGRICOLA, and PsycFIRST. The same SmartLinks feature described above for MLA is also available in these databases.

-PROQUEST-

GALILEO's core ProQuest databases are undergoing some changes this year. Because of limited funding, the K-12 community will unfortunately lose access to all ProQuest databases later this month. Other consortia continue to have access to ProQuest databases, but with the following changes:

- * Publications currently available in full-text through EBSCO's Academic Search Premier will be removed from ProQuest Research Library in the coming months, resulting in a database that includes only ProQuest's unique full-text titles.
- * ABI/INFORM databases now feature links to Hoover's Online company information.
- * Literature Online Reference Edition, the Chadwyck-Healey database of literary criticism, reference, and biography, will be added later in July.
- * Full-text databases of the Wall Street Journal, the New York Times, the Christian Science Monitor, the Washington Post, and the Los Angeles Times are accessible from ProQuest's Collections menu; entries for these newspapers will appear on GALILEO's database menus soon.

ProQuest will introduce an updated interface later this summer. A preview is

-FIRSTSEARCH-

Besides the FirstSearch databases that are being replaced by EBSCOhost equivalents for the University System of Georgia, other FirstSearch databases have also been removed from USG institutions' GALILEO menus to conserve the consortium's remaining search credits. Beginning July 2, only the following FirstSearch databases will be accessible to USG until the current pool of search credits is depleted: Alternative Press Index, Applied Science and Technology Index, Art Index, BasicBIOSIS, EconLit, Education Index, Esssay and General Literature Index, General Science Index, Library Literature, and PAIS International. At the current rate of searching, we expect access to these databases to continue for one to two months.

The technical colleges' current pool of FirstSearch searches will also be depleted later this fiscal year. At the current rate, these colleges' access to FirstSearch databases may continue for three to four months.

All consortia except K-12 continue to have access to FirstSearch's base package of databases, which includes the following: ArticleFirst, ERIC, GPO Monthly Catalog, MEDLINE, OCLC Union List of Periodicals, PapersFirst, ProceedingsFirst, World Almanacs, and WorldCat. Because access to this database package is provided by annual subscription, these databases will remain accessible throughout the fiscal year.

FirstSearch will introduce a new user interface on July 13. A preview is available at http://fsdemo.oclc.org/.

-OTHER-

Because of limited funding, technical colleges have unfortunately lost access to Encyclopedia Britannica Online and NewsBank's Atlanta Journal-Constitution database and Big6 Resource Center.

We hope that our users will benefit from the positive changes in GALILEO's resources this year and will take even greater advantage of the databases retained from past years. Discontinuation of DataTimes Database

OCLC will remove the DataTimes database from all FirstSearch accounts on July 8, 2003, and this database will no longer appear in GALILEO database menus. OCLC's reasons for this change are outlined in the announcement below.

ADVANCE NOTICE OF DISCONTINUATION OF THE DATATIMES DATABASE

Following a financial review and evaluation of the viability of the database in the OCLC FirstSearch service, OCLC has decided to remove the DataTimes database from FirstSearch effective July 8, 2003.

DataTimes provides bibliographic citations and abstracts to news features in over 130 regional United States and a few international newspapers. Its usage on FirstSearch has steadily declined, and there are no current FirstSearch subscriptions to DataTimes. OCLC believes that maintaining the database on FirstSearch is no longer the best use of libraries' and OCLC's resources.

Effective immediately, no new subscriptions will be accepted. Per-search users of this database might consider Business Dateline and Newspaper Abstracts as possible alternatives for newspaper information.

ADVANCE NOTICE OF DISCONTINUATION OF THE EVENTLINE DATABASE

Excerpta Medica has informed OCLC that it will no longer be updating its EventLine database, available on FirstSearch and other information services, after March 2003. Consequently, the EventLine database will be discontinued on the OCLC FirstSearch service with effect from April 1, 2003.

The EventLine database formerly provided information about events in several subject areas scheduled worldwide. Recently, the database provider has limited its focus to cover only events in the medical, biotechnology and scientific fields. Furthermore, its usage on FirstSearch has steadily declined in recent years. OCLC believes that maintaining an outdated database of events on FirstSearch is no longer the best use of libraries' and OCLC's resources. Users can now find information on scheduled events in several association websites on the Internet, many at no cost.

We are glad to announce two databases that have been added to the Digital Library of Georgia: Georgia Historic Books database and Historic Architecture and Landscapes of Georgia: The Hubert Bond Owens and John Linley Image Collections at the Owens Library.

The Georgia Historic Books database contains full-text, fully searchable books related to Georgia's history and culture. Most are from the 19th to early 20th century and focus on Georgia history, biography, and literature. This database will ultimately contain about 300 titles. Currently, 76 titles have been entered. Books in this collection have been selected from bibliographies on Georgia history and also on counsel by historians, librarians, and other experts on the literature and history of Georgia.

Historic Architecture and Landscapes of Georgia: The Hubert Bond Owens and John Linley Image Collections at the Owens Library contains images of important and representative architectural sites and landscapes in the state, with an emphasis on Athens and Middle Georgia. Included are images of color slides and black and white photographs taken from the 1940s through the 1980s. Images in this collection are drawn from collections held at the Owens Library in the College of Environment and Design at the University of Georgia.

Patient Education records are available in English or Spanish.

EBSCO/ProQuest Evaluation

As many of you are aware, a project to assess the database offerings from EBSCO and ProQuest is underway. The GALILEO Steering Committee and its subcommittees are always in the process of evaluating the database offerings in GALILEO. In times of economic difficulties (lower state revenues, increased unemployment, increased enrollments, and lower returns on privately endowed funds), it is essential to assess how we can provide the most useful resources to GALILEO users at the most reasonable cost. You may remember that the GALILEO Steering Committee and its subcommittees, and GALILEO staff did a thorough review in November 2001. Given the changes during the past year in content (additions, deletions, embargoes, exclusive titles, expected additions) and introduction of new interfaces and services, as well as the tight budget environment, it is prudent to conduct another assessment.

Both EBSCO and ProQuest offer a range of databases. Both EBSCO and ProQuest offer large, multi-disciplinary databases that include many full-text journals (EBSCO's Academic Search Premier and ProQuest's Research Library). In addition both vendors provide business databases that include full-text journals. Both vendors provide the capability to search multiple databases simultaneously. Some, but not all, of their other database offerings are subsets of those "primary" databases. Each has unique titles as well as there being overlap.
