# WHAT RESOURCES ARE WE TALKING ABOUT?

Statewide Resources

- Large multidisc aggregate content
- Funded by GALILEO and communities
- Under purview of GALSTEER and the E-Resources Committee

#### Group Resources

- Resources tailored for entire communities
- Funded centrally by the community
- Assessed by each leadership of each groups

Individual Resources

- Specialized and subject specific resources
- Usually limited to current statewide and group vendors
- Paid by individual public and higher ed
- Assessment left to each library

## WHAT ARE OUR CURRENT POLICIES?

# **GOAL 2 – E-Resources/Content**

Provide a robust set of electronic resources (open and licensed) that meet the lifelong learning needs of all Georgians, leveraging local and statewide purchasing power.

GALILEO will provide a **collaborative**, <u>efficient</u> approach to managing the content of its statewide and stakeholder-specific e-resource portfolios, including <u>open</u> and **licensed** content. A committee will be in place that will analyze usage and other metrics, make recommendations on selection/deselection, and help communicate the value of these resources to other stakeholders and funders. A robust set of core E-Resources will be available to level the playing field for all Georgians. Statewide purchasing power will be **further leveraged** to license stakeholder-specific content, with options available for individual access to those resources via <u>ILL or other methods</u>. Local purchasing power will be increased through the expansion and improvement of the <u>opt-in</u> cost share process. Discovery of E-Resources will be increased through user interface, personalization and authentication improvements. <u>Communication</u> and partnership between stakeholder groups will be improved through technology such as Electronic Resource Management (ERM)tools.

## WHAT ARE OUR CURRENT POLICIES?

### **Licensing Requirements**

 Most significant is that we generally need one year agreements that do not automatically renew

### Library Specific Terms

- Broad definitions of authorized users, including walk-ins
- ILL, course reserve, and scholarly sharing

### **Other Areas**

- Accessibility and VPATS
- Data mining, etc.?

## WHAT HAVE WE DONE RECENTLY?

- Established an E-Resources Committee under GALSTEER that provides early feedback on offers, evaluates current resources, and organizes assessment
- E-Resources survey for each community type
- Provide cost/use reports for each community
- Currently implementing ConsortiaManager to improve costshare process
