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

Virtual Learning Journey: Warm Springs



Hail to the Chief and Warm Springs, Georgia! Warm Springs serves as home to President Franklin Delano Roosevelt's Little White House and the natural springs that were historically used for polio treatment. Roosevelt had the Little White House built in 1932, and frequently visited during his presidency. The Warm Springs virtual field trip explores Franklin Delano Roosevelt's personal ties to Georgia, including his struggle with polio and his interaction with Georgia citizens.

Through two primary source activities and a short video, understand how Franklin embodied Enlightenment values, and used his talent in writing and printing to have his opinions heard and help shape the world.

Lesson summary

Franklin's widespread interests and numerous fields of endeavor make him the American epitome of the Age of Enlightenment. In this lesson, students will reflect on the parallels between our own age and the one in which Franklin lived and worked. After viewing a short video about Franklin, they will read some of Franklin's adages through an Enlightenment lens and examine a symbol-rich portrait of Franklin. The lesson culminates with students imagining Benjamin Franklin's present-day social media presence.

Vocabulary

- **Patent** - a license given by a government to the creator of an invention giving them the sole right to make, use, and sell that invention for a set period of time
- **Abolitionist** - someone who wanted the institution of slavery ended
- **Persecuted** - harassed or very badly treated, generally for reasons relating to identity or beliefs
- **Patriot** - a person who believed that the American colonies should become independent from Great Britain
- **Loyalist** - a person who thought that the American colonies should continue to be part of Great Britain

Lewis and Clark Expedition, (1804–06), U.S. military expedition, led by Capt. **Meriwether Lewis** and Lieut. **William Clark**, to explore the **Louisiana Purchase** and the **Pacific Northwest**. The expedition was a major chapter in the history of American exploration.

Commissioning and preparation

On January 18, 1803, U.S. Pres. **Thomas Jefferson** sent a secret message to **Congress** asking for \$2,500 to send an officer and a dozen soldiers to explore the **Missouri River**, make diplomatic contact with Indians, expand the American fur trade, and locate the **Northwest Passage** (the much-sought-after hypothetical northwestern water route to the **Pacific Ocean**). The proposed trip took on added significance on May 2, when the United States agreed to the Louisiana Purchase—**Napoleon's** sale of 828,000 square miles (2,100,000 square km) of French territory for \$27 million.

Franklin D. Roosevelt, in full Franklin Delano Roosevelt, byname FDR, (born January 30, 1882, Hyde Park, New York, U.S.—died April 12, 1945, Warm Springs, Georgia), 32nd president of the United States (1933–45). The only president elected to the office four times, Roosevelt led the United States through two of the greatest crises of the 20th century: the **Great Depression** and **World War II**. In so doing, he greatly expanded the powers of the federal government through a series of programs and reforms known as the **New Deal**, and he served as the principal architect of the successful effort to rid the world of German **National Socialism** and Japanese militarism.

Early life

Roosevelt was the only child of James and Sara Delano Roosevelt. The family
