Georgia Public Library Service Update

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2022 Legislative Session Highlights





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FY22 amended budget

- \$2 million for technology grants to public libraries
- \$3 million for Major Repair/Renovation in public libraries

FY23 budget

- State-reimbursed library positions were included in the \$5,000 COLA
- Library materials grant increased from \$.40 per capita to \$.60 per capita, for a total increase of \$2,214,123
- \$2 million in bond funding for Major Repair/Renovation in public libraries
- Approximately \$10 million in bond funding for 6 library construction projects






Statistics





Library Statistics

- Over 4.4 million, 40% of Georgians have a library card; this held steady during the pandemic.
- Georgia is one of four states piloting WiFi usage project with IMLS
- For the first time in two years, 100% of library systems in the state are just about back to usual service and hours!
- As of March 25, 2022, 70% of library systems have restored services to the same as before the pandemic.
- Two thirds continue to offer curbside service as of March 2022.
- Ebook circulation as a percentage of total circulation increased by 45% from FY2020 to FY2021.





Library Statistics

Some FY2021 statistics:

- 61 library systems (60 as of FY2022)
- 408 facilities, including 9 bookmobiles
- Total square footage of Georgia public library buildings is 5,500,950 sq ft
- 2,737 Full Time Equivalent staff members
- Operating expenditures of the library systems was \$212,466,196.
- Circulation for FY2021: over 24.7 million.

Marketing Grants

Since 2018, more than 50 library systems have applied for these grants. Typically we award 6-8 per year. Campaigns took place in April 2022.

Types of AV items borrowed:





Cybersecurity

- GPLS cybersecurity program started providing 2 new services for Georgia's libraries:
 - Filtered DNS-allowing libraries to manage their filtering on a granular level and have more control over their filtering rules without taking on the burden of local hardware to manage;
 - Risk assessments for libraries, was launched in October 2021. Libraries will participate in this program in order to discover their risks, determine the proper mitigation path, and justify additional funding and resources to improve their overall cybersecurity stance



Libraries Without Walls Grants

- Funded by CARES Act through the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS)
- Five focus areas:
 - broadband infrastructure
 - Chromebook lending
 - G Suite migrations
 - tech innovation
 - Wi-Fi expansion.
- **63 projects** were funded to **40 library systems** with \$558,210.70 in funding spent.



Information Technology American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Relief Grants

- Expanded on GPLS Libraries Without Walls grant program to include new areas: digital inclusion, eBooks, and technology:
 - Device lending
 - Digitization
 - eBooks and audiobooks
 - Equipment replacement and upgrades
- Outreach vehicles
- Remote book lockers
- Self-check stations
- Goal to support libraries as they transition to a hybrid service model of in-person and virtual services.
- By the end of March 2022, 139
 projects were funded and \$1,257,890.63 in funding was spent
