- What started as a project of 24 universities in **2008** has grown exponentially to include more than **200 member** libraries (including the University System of Georgia). These libraries have contributed digital content to more than **18 million items**.
- Approximately **40%** of the items are in the **public domain**; in particular, **U.S. federal documents** account for more than **1.4 million** items.
- HathiTrust continues to demonstrate its commitment to expand and facilitate lawful access to digitized books.

- The collection includes all kinds of digitized primary and secondary source materials, suiting a wide range of research needs. The largest areas covered are language and literature, philosophy, religion, history, and social sciences.
- **Formats** include books, magazines, newspapers, journals, sheet music, and government documents, etc. (no audio/visual files).
- English language titles make up 51% of the collection.
- 95% of the collection was digitized from print by Google and contributed by [member](#) libraries. HathiTrust provides some titles that Google does not, such as digital collections and titles unique to each institution, as well as works from institutional repositories.

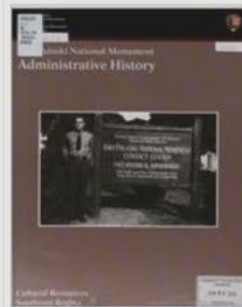

- Copyrighted items are **not available to read** (Listed as *Limited (search-only)*). **Searches** can be conducted *within these texts*.
- **No one** is able to read or download titles that are **restricted by copyright law** except in certain circumstances and services.
- **Local copyright laws** also impact the availability of titles to read, and **restrictions** from the **vendors that digitized** individual titles may impact how they can be downloaded.

- Membership or an account is **not** required to access HathiTrust. Much of the collection is available to search, read, and research, as allowable by copyright law.
- Public domain or open access licensing. Full View
 - Anyone can **read** titles available to them in the public domain or by open access licensing.
 - Other items are open to read and/or **download** because they are in the **public domain** (which means **copyright laws do not apply** to those items) or **licensed as open access** (both are listed as *Full View*)

Downloading public domain works

- **Guest** users, download
 - Guest users can download public domain works in their entirety that do not have download restrictions (e.g., works digitized by Internet Archive and certain other organizations, or works that have been opened with a Creative Commons license).
 - **Guest** users can only download works one page a time if they do have download restrictions (e.g. a work that was digitized by Google).
- **Member** institution, download
 - **Logged in** users that are affiliated with **HathiTrust member institutions** are able to **download all public domain** works in their **entirety** (regardless of the digitization source) as well as works made available under Creative Commons licenses.
 - Download format options include **PDF**; EPUB; Text (.txt); Text (.zip); Image (jpg).

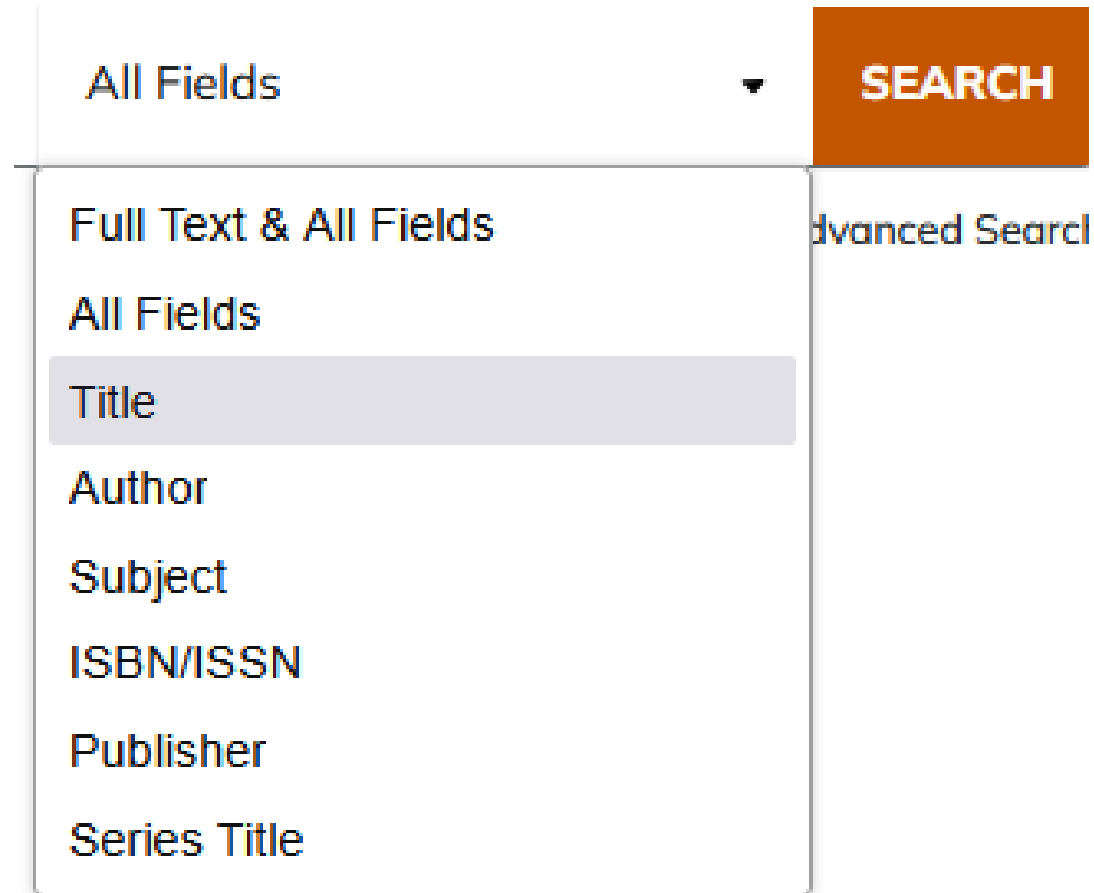
HathiTrust Search Basics

The search bar can be searched from every page of the website and digital library. Expand the search bar by clicking on the Search link in the site header. Two basic options to begin a search:

- **Search the Website:** Search the content of the HathiTrust information website using keywords. This DOES NOT include the digital library content that you find in the Collection.
- **Search the Collection:** By default, the search results will include all the texts that are available to access online for this search, indicated as “Full View”. These titles are available to access here because they are in the public domain or licensed as open access. To also include texts that are restricted by copyright in these search results, specify “All Items” under “Item Viewability.”

Basic Search

- A basic search (upper right of screen) allows for field searching as well as full text.

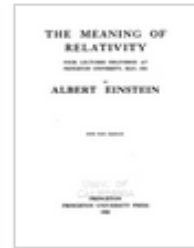

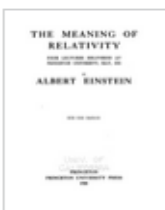

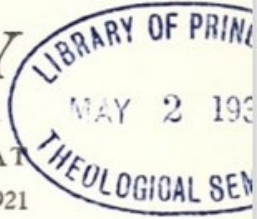

Search Using Keywords

- Keyword search allows for searching for topics, quotes, names, places, or phrases in both the information Website and the Collection.

Search Options

- When searching the Collection a search can be conducted using Full Text & All Fields to search all the text of all the volumes in the entire digital library including book information such as Title or Author.
- A search can be narrowed to only book information, such as Title, Publisher, and Author, by choosing All Fields indicated in the dropdown menu options. Use other specific fields in the dropdown menu when the exact information is known: the exact Title, Publisher, Author, or other book information.

thing less than a pleasure, but quite necessary, to appear here to discuss the quality of our Chattahoochee River, which we all know is grossly polluted.

Officials of the City of Atlanta have studied the "Report on Pollution of the Chattahoochee River" prepared by staff members of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and take very few exceptions to its contents.

The recommendations contained on pages 32 and 33 of this report are quite in keeping with present policies and immediate plans of the City of Atlanta in that:

1. The City of Atlanta and her metropolitan partners in the metropolitan sewer system are presently pursuing a \$41 million scheduled program of pollution

abatement on the Chattahoochee River approved by the Georgia Water Quality Control Board. This program is reflected in the "Report on Water Pollution Control for the Chattahoochee River," which has been submitted as a supplement to this statement and accepted by the panel.

2. The Atlanta program provides for near future provision of secondary treatment with effluent chlorination at all water pollution control facilities. The operation of existing and future waste treatment facilities is and will continue to be superior in nature. Fecal coliform bacteria analyses will be added to normal control testing procedure.

3. It is standing policy to encourage and accept industrial discharges into the sewers and treatment facilities of the Atlanta metropolitan sewer system. This policy will continue.

4. No new combined sewers are being constructed in the Atlanta metropolitan system and the first project

The Atkinson and McDonough steam-electric generating plants downstream from the Clayton Plant raise the temperature of the river by use of the river water for condenser cooling. This newly recognized hazard, known as thermal pollution, significantly decreases the ability of the river to assimilate organic wastes safely. When operating at full load, the generating plants will increase the maximum average daily river temperature from 20°C. to 34°C. at minimum river flow at 700 CFS at the Atlanta gage. At a 34°C. temperature, dissolved oxygen content cannot be maintained at the 4PPM which is desirable to prevent nuisance and maintain aquatic life. However, this high temperature is not expected

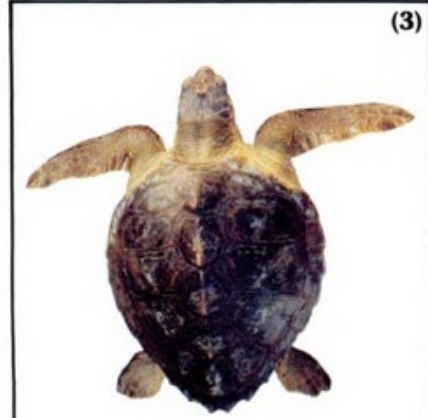
SEA TURTLES of the ATLANTIC and GULF COAST of the UNITED STATES and their status under the ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT (ESA)



(1) KEMP'S RIDLEY SEA TURTLE (1)
(Lepidochelys kempi)
Smallest of the sea turtles. Adults do not exceed 30 inches in shell length and range in weight from 80-100 pounds. The broadly oval shaped shell is usually olive gray, but young are black. Found in the coastal waters and bays of the Gulf of Mexico and Atlantic where they forage predominantly on crabs. Only a few hundred females nest in the state of Tamaulipas, Mexico, each year.
ESA Status: **ENDANGERED**



(2) HAWKSBILL SEA TURTLE (2)
(Eretmochelys imbricata)
Small to medium sea turtles with a very attractively colored shell of thick, overlapping scales...the source of "tortoise shell". Has distinct hawk-like beak. Adults range in size from 30-36 inches shell length and weigh 100-200 pounds. A shy tropical reef dwelling species where it forages primarily on sponges.
ESA Status: **ENDANGERED**




(3) LOGGERHEAD SEA TURTLE (3)
(Caretta caretta)
A large reddish-brown sea turtle with a disproportionately large head. Adults range in size from 33-40 inches shell length and weigh 150-400 pounds. This is the most common sea turtle encountered in the southeastern United States. Frequently observed around wrecks, underwater structures, and reefs where it forages on a variety of crabs, jellyfish, and mollusks.
ESA Status: **THREATENED**

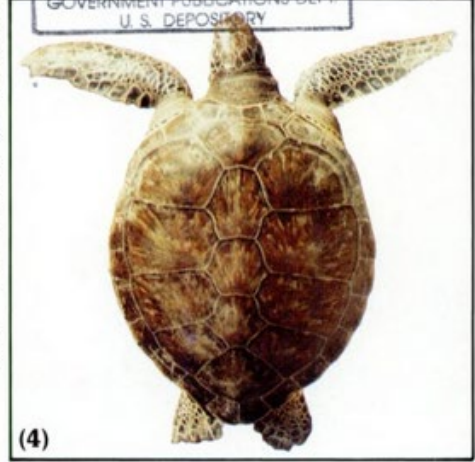

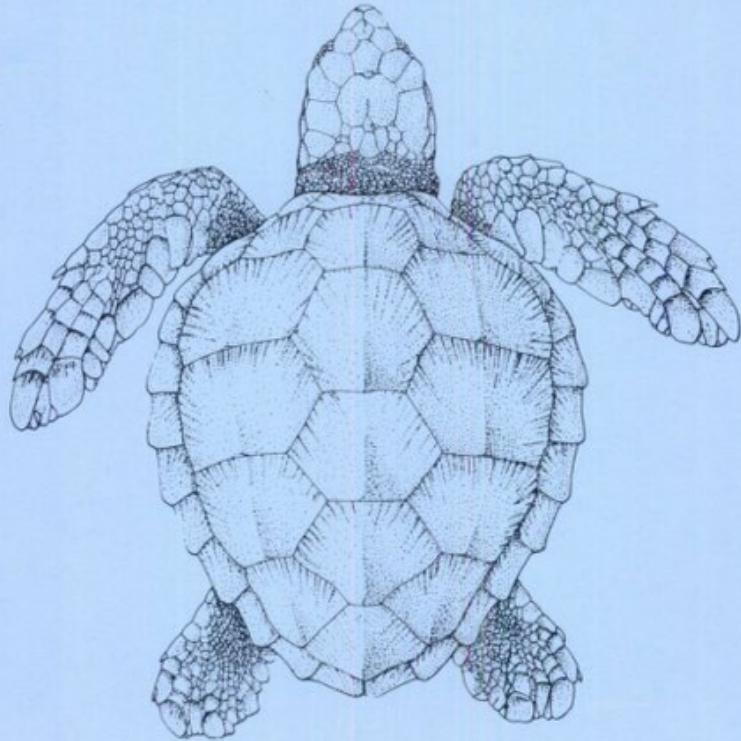
GREEN SEA TURTLE (4)
(Chelonia mydas)
A medium to large brownish sea turtle with a radiating or mottled pattern of markings on the shell. The head is small in comparison to other sea turtles and the biting edge of the lower jaw is serrated. Adult shell lengths range in size from 36-43 inches and weights average 200-300 pounds. Primarily a tropical herbivorous species, the juveniles frequently occur in Florida waters, especially in areas abundant in sea grasses.
ESA Status: **ENDANGERED** for Florida and east Pacific breeding populations; **THREATENED** everywhere else.



LEATHERBACK SEA TURTLE (5) *(Dermochelys coriacea)*
The largest sea turtle. Can attain a shell length of six feet and weights of 1,400 pounds. Black with white blotches, the shell lacks scales and is covered by a firm, rubbery skin with seven longitudinal ridges or keels. A highly migratory turtle that nests in the tropics and ranges as far north as Canada and the northern Pacific. Feeds primarily on jellyfish.
ESA Status: **ENDANGERED**

3.5.3 Responses to stimuli

The U.S. Federal Documents Program initiative expands access to and preserves U.S. federal publications.

- **Emergency Temporary Access Service**

HathiTrust's Emergency Temporary Access Service permits temporary, emergency access to the collection for member libraries during service disruptions caused by everything from a global pandemic to the catastrophic impacts of climate change.

- **Shared Print Program**

HathiTrust's Shared Print Program has developed a distributed, shared network of print collections retained in tandem with HathiTrust's digital preservation services.

- **Copyright Review Program**

The Copyright Review Program at HathiTrust researches the copyright status of works in the collection, relying on an expert review team to find and open public domain materials in the U.S. and around the world.

- The [Emergency](#) Temporary Access Service (ETAS) permits special access for HathiTrust member institutions that suffer an *unexpected* or *involuntary, temporary disruption* to normal operations, such as closure for a public health emergency (such as [COVID-19](#)) or natural disaster requiring the library to be temporarily closed to its patrons
- Accessible Text Request Service ([ATRS](#)). Persons who are affiliated with a HathiTrust member institution using ATRS, and who are either blind or have a print disability, can request a copy of a copyrighted book in the HathiTrust collection.

Anonymity prevailed. Famous names were disguised and occupations were not mentioned. Drivers licenses, auto registrations, bank accounts, income tax returns, food and gasoline rations and insurance policies were issued to numbers.

Tight security regulations plagued scientific progress, too. The military insisted that individual scientific projects be strictly compartmentalized and not discussed so that no one could see the overall progress — or purpose — of the mission. But Director Oppenheimer, knowing that cross-fertilization of ideas among scientists is infinitely useful in solving problems, balked and as a result weekly colloquia were begun and continue in Los Alamos today. - **HathiTrust + Bookworm.** Visualizes word trends in millions of volumes held by HathiTrust.
- **Algorithms.** HTRC Algorithms are click-to-run tools for text analysis. They require no programming, and researchers can set the parameters for their analysis. Use them to explore HathiTrust worksets, which are groups of titles from the collection.
- **Datasets and Data APIs.** A dataset compiles specific features extracted from the full text of the HathiTrust corpus. HathiTrust also provides access to several data APIs.
- **Data Capsules.** An advanced computing environment available only to HathiTrust members, data capsules provide high-capacity computing for advanced text analysis. Limited access to in-copyright material may be available to HathiTrust members.
