2. What Are the Types of Infographics?

Infographics are usually displayed as one or a combination of these types:

Compare/Contrast: Illustrates notable similarities or differences as a table or simply a list with graphics.

Geographic: Displays data with a location map (e.g., smoking rates per state in the U.S.).

Hierarchy: Demonstrates a chart with levels (e.g., organizational chart).

Information: Similar to a poster, summarizes information from an article or other research visually.

Process: Demonstrates a process as a how-to (e.g., a recipe), to teach the workings of an object or principle (e.g., photosynthesis), or flow chart to show choices in a decision process.

Time-Oriented: Displays data over a chronological time period (e.g., timeline).

Statistical: Showcases one or more graphs, tables or lists to display data.

About the Author

Author: George Orwell

The year was 1948. Dying of tuberculosis, George Orwell pushed himself to the limits of physical exertion to complete the manuscript for what would become his best-known work, the novel 1984. Mitzi Brunsdale, author of a recent biography of Orwell, notes that he wrote the book while "continually coughing up blood and near collapse" (Brunsdale 16). Ironically, the suffering that accompanied the production of Orwell's final work also coincided with the highest point of literary fame he would personally experience (Brunsdale 16).

Orwell was born Eric Arthur Blair on 25 June 1903 in Motahari, Bengal. His father was a sub-deputy Opium Agent in His Majesty's Bengal Civil Service. Orwell's mother was half her husband's age. According to the custom of the day, she left India to provide an education in England for her children. Orwell's father did not accompany them.

In the 1850s, '60s, and '70s the Pre-Raphaelites appropriated Keats's predominantly aestheticist values, Tennyson's sensuousness, and Ruskin's enthusiastic worship of beauty, to foster a decorative conception of art and literature instead of an ethically oriented one. In the 1870s and later the influence of Walter Pater was paramount. He urged the sensitive individual "to burn always with this hard gemlike flame" and to find the most precious moments in the pursuit of sensations raised to the pitch of "the poetic passion, the desire of beauty, the love of art for art's sake." In the 1880s and '90s, the subjectivity (as in Keats and Shelley) and the sometimes exaggerated individualism (as in Byron) of romanticism encouraged the "Aesthetic Movement," as it came to be embodied in the paintings of James McNeill Whistler and in the poetry and life of Oscar Wilde and his coterie.

It provides a comprehensive survey of the early history of African American poetry, from the first recorded poem by an African American (Lucy Terry Prince's 'Bars Fight', c.1746) to the major poets of the nineteenth century, including Paul Laurence Dunbar and Frances Ellen Watkins Harper.

The authors and works included in the collection show the huge variety of this relatively unexplored area of American literary history. Coverage includes writers from both North and South, from rural and urban backgrounds, and ranges from university-educated professionals to those for whom the very acts of reading and writing constituted a defiance of Southern slave laws.
