# **GALILEO Strategic Plan**

GALILEO has several long-term goals outlined in its strategic plan (on the website at this <u>link</u>). Below is an update on the projects for fiscal year 2020.

# **GALILEO Support Activities**

### **OpenAthens**

- GALILEO Support is now working to bring GPALS and AMPALS libraries online. GALILEO Support Services (GSS) is currently meeting to plan with individual institutions, most recently: Piedmont College, Morehouse School of Medicine (now live), Oglethorpe University, Brenau University and Wesleyan College.
- Preparations are well under way to get the final USG institutions, UGA and Augusta University, live as soon as possible.
- New recordings for training (general OpenAthens administration and managing guest users) are now available on the OpenAthens LibGuide.

## **GALILEO Development Advisory Committee (GDAC)**

The GALILEO portal redesign team continues to aggregate and implement recommendations from the GDAC team. On April 21, we met with the team for additional input on the design. Comments focused mostly on the look and feel of the homepage, including the central search area, wording, and the login page. Another meeting is planned for late May.

# **GALILEO Redesign**

The redesign team has met (as a complete team or in separate groups) during the month of April to finetune various areas related to communication, the contact us forms, requirements for GALILEO's kids' views and more. We have incorporated GDAC feedback and released the demo site for accessibility testing. Barring any unforeseen issues, we plan to begin sharing the final design widely in mid-June with a go-live date of July 21.

Additionally, after looking at about 20 designers and illustrators, a scope of work was sent to five designers for the creation of hero images for the portal redesign. We expect to choose a designer by May 8, with the expectation that final designs will be completed in June.

- Completed the implementation of the new GALILEO database search
- Aggregated and implemented feedback from GDAC and CIDI on the GALILEO staging site
- Set up the "Spotlight" resources portion of the page, and made that area customizable for up to six links to resources or services
- Integrated the EBSCO Discover Search (EDS) into the new portal infrastructure
- Implemented changes to the EDS profiles in order to improve search functionality and results
- Implemented improvements to the GALILEO contact us forms and support pages, including a new more general contact form and improvements to the technical support form
- Completed the integration of different GALILEO views into the K-12 sites (elementary, middle and high school)
- Added an "educator" view to the K-12 portal sites designed to support the research of educators and education students at K-12 institutions
- Submitted the staging site to the Center for Inclusive Design and Innovation for accessibility review

• Completed analysis and prioritization of feedback gathered from the Curriculum Builder survey and send to EBSCO for review. After EBSCO reviews, we will meet with EBSCO to discuss.

## Affordable Learning Georgia

#### **Textbook Transformation Grants:**

- The deadline for round 17 was April 20. We received 25 traditional grant proposals, as well as 13 for mini grants. Peer reviews are expected to conclude May 4, and administrative reviews by May 7. Grantees will be notified on or by May 8.
- The kickoff meeting will take place June 1 online. Because of this, the \$800 budget item for travel and overall project expenses, which is normally required, will be an optional item for overall project expenses. Grantees must define what they will use these funds for clearly in the application.
- Spring 2020 final and semester status reports are now due June 12, 2020.

Manifold Pilot Phase 2: With six proof-of-concept textbooks added to OpenALG, ALG continues to review the accessibility and structure of all USG open textbooks in preparation to add more texts to OpenALG. This accessibility audit will likely result in major revisions to all ALG open textbooks. Integration of full-text newspaper content into the DLG's Georgia portal is DLG's priority for the rest of this fiscal year and the following fiscal year. Meetings with other large digital libraries who have incorporated newspaper content have taken place (Portal to Texas History, Digital Commonwealth (MA), University of Utah, and Library of Congress), and a preliminary plan is in development.
