# **GALILEO Strategic Plan**

GALILEO has several long-term goals outlined in its strategic plan (on the website at this <u>link</u>). Below is an update on the projects for fiscal year 2020.

# **GALILEO Administrative Updates**

- The USG libraries have reached the end of the initial contract terms for the Ex Libris Alma/Primo platform, so Lucy has been working with that vendor to renegotiate terms. She will provide an update at the RACL Exec and full RACL meetings. In the meantime, Ex Libris is planning several webinars and virtual trainings specifically designed for GIL staff, committees, and/or libraries.
- OCLC President Skip Prichard is expected to attend the upcoming ICOLC North America meeting to discuss various member concerns and issues one of which is the GALILEO concern that all libraries' holdings should display in the public version of WorldCat.org at no additional charge. Lucy and GSU library dean Jeff Steely plan to attend the meeting.
- The Elsevier e-Journal negotiations are now complete. We were able to achieve a significant improvement in contract terms and long-term pricing for participating libraries. We will be gathering feedback on the process from libraries in USG, AMPALS, and GPALS. We will also ask those groups which additional e-journal vendor(s) they would like us to negotiate with this year.
- The USG is undergoing a revision and redesign of its GenEd Core. Julius Fleschner (Georgia Highlands) is representing the libraries in that effort. Information literacy is a major part of the new redesign.

### **GALILEO Development Advisory Committee (GDAC)**

- CIDI has conducted at least two accessibility training for the committee; more scheduled for the future
- The committee continues to support the GALILEO redesign efforts. In February, the committee provided feedback on the search elements of the homepage. That feedback was aggregated and reviewed by the GALILEO team, with the goal of simplifying the main GALILEO search.
- In March, the committee will provide feedback on the "spotlight" areas of the homepage. These areas are expected to feature resources that individual libraries decide is important.

### **GALILEO Redesign**

In addition to ongoing conversations on design, the GALILEO team met in February to outline the timeline for the portal changes. In order to complete a redesign of the homepage and related integrated pages, significant changes are needed. These include, but are not limited to: customizations for kids' views, the OpenAthens Wayfinder, announcement area for GALILEO announcements, institutional customizations, USL redirects, and more.

The tentative go-live date for the redesigned interface is summer 2020. However, training and testing for affected institutions, as well as internal testing (including accessibility and usability) and changes are expected. This may postpone the go-live date. Care is being taken to work around most school and university calendars to ensure proper communication and best timing of training.

GALILEO is expected to update the public of the key timeline dates as soon as possible.

#### Portal Team:

The team continues to work on ironing out portal changes for the GALILEO redesign. These include:

- Deciding guidelines for images to be used by institutions on the homepage
- Reviewing the subject categories for GALILEO search, analyzing use and mapping
- Integrating GDAC and CIDI feedback, with the goal of having a log-in page ready by the next GDAC meeting

#### Admin Team:

- Met with UGA, GSU, Agnes Scott, LaGrange, and Valdosta to demo and gather feedback about new institutional user role. Feedback was very positive. Uncovered a few minor bugs.
- Working with Portal Team on development needs for portal features.

#### **GIL/GALILEO Conferences**

Registration is slow, so additional communication has been sent to GIL members. The GAC committee continues working to finalize a keynote speaker. Proposal submission have been closed, and the committee is working on finalizing sessions. A final agenda is expected by April. # Affordable Learning Georgia

#### **Textbook Transformation Grants**

- New Program Manager: Tiffani Reardon is the new program manager for Affordable Learning Georgia. Previously the recipient of nine Textbook Transformation Grants as an instructional designer in the Kennesaw State University College of Humanities and Social Sciences, Tiffani has a background in both instructional design and technical communication. She also is pursuing her Ph.D. in Technical Communication and Rhetoric from Texas Tech University.
- Round 17 Grants: Current Request for Proposals for the 17<sup>th</sup> round of Textbook Transformation Grants. Deadline: April 6, 2020. Projects have a maximum final semester of summer 2021.
- Manifold Pilot: Affordable Learning Georgia is working with their open textbook publishing partner, the <u>University of North Georgia Press</u>, to bring UNG Press texts into OpenALG, the pilot instance of Manifold for ALG. The UNG Press is working to create a more structured, webfriendly version of the texts in order for Manifold to properly transform them into highlight-ready, annotation-ready, and responsive materials.
- **OER Accessibility Guides**: For the round 16 kickoff meeting, Tiffani Reardon created a new set of OER accessibility guides for grantees, designed with faculty OER authors in mind. These guides are open-licensed (CC BY 4.0) and available to the public within the <u>ALG accessibility webpage</u>. The guides cover document design, alt text, captioning/transcripts, and accessibility checkers, along with an accessibility checklist for OER.

#### **Digital Public Library of America**

DLG currently is the 10th largest contributor of records to DPLA with 700,777 item records. The next harvest is scheduled for June.

### **Development**

The following Georgia portal improvements debuted in late January: holding institution pages, IIIF viewer integration, full-text display (if available), and enhanced collection pages. A test instance of Spotlight and draft site design template have been deployed in preparation for the launch of DLG/NGE co-branded exhibits in fall 2020.

Integration of full-text newspaper content into the DLG's Georgia portal is DLG's priority for the rest of this fiscal year and the following fiscal year.

#### **Subgranting**

Proposals for the first round of <u>FY 2020/2021 subgrants</u> are due April 14 for a project start date of July 1, 2020.

#### **Archival Management Systems**

We are working with Atlanta History Center to move them from Archivists Toolkit to ArchivesSpace over the spring. Conversations with Georgia Historical Society are pending. A test instance of ArchivesSpace is available for testing the feasibility of a statewide finding aid repository.

#### **Outreach**

DLG/NGE's exhibit intern is developing an online exhibit on theatre in Georgia that will debut in fall 2020. Work is underway on an exhibit on newspapers in Georgia. We will begin advertising for our summer interns in March. We plan to have three interns (two in Athens and one in Atlanta) during the summer.
