GALILEO Development Advisory Committee (GDAC)

The advisory committee will meet March 23. Discussions will continue regarding the second phase of GALILEO redesign. New member APS media specialist Lori McCall joined the team and meeting for the first time in February.

GALILEO Redesign

The GALILEO redesign team continues to work on the Phase 2 update, which is planned for mid- to late-July. The main feature developers are working on is a Bento box search approach. By the July launch, the team is expected to also deploy a beta site for review by targeted audiences, create and update relevant FAQs, create a release notes webpage where the public can be updated on progress, and create relevant training for librarians.

However, additional features and updates will continue be implemented in an ongoing fashion. These updates include differentiated views for public library audiences, better highlighting the "change view" button on the GALILEO Search home page, revised hero and thumbnail image for the high school view, an updated embeddable search bar design and more.

Subgrant Applications due June 2, 2021

To broaden partner participation in the Digital Library of Georgia (DLG), DLG is soliciting proposals for historic digitization projects costing up to \$7500 in DLG services from non-profit Georgia cultural heritage institutions. Applicant organizations must be open to the public, and their collections must be available for public research either by appointment or through regular hours. Project metadata will be included in the DLG portal and the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA). Projects may include the reformatting of textual materials (not including newspapers), graphic materials, or audio-visual materials. Applicants should have materials prepared for a project start date of **September 1, 2021**.

ArchivesSpace

Discoverability Discussion Group, March 11, 2 pm
