GALILEO Monthly Update – July 2020

GALILEO Strategic Plan

GALILEO has several long-term goals outlined in its strategic plan (on the website at this <u>link</u>). Below is an update on the projects for fiscal year 2020.

GALILEO Support Activities

OpenAthens

Brenau University is scheduled to go live on August 16. Augusta University went live in early August, and the final USG institution to go live will be UGA in December.

GALILEO Development Advisory Committee (GDAC)

GALILEO held a July GDAC meeting to review the launch of the redesign. The time was also used to thank members for the past year of assistance, ask whether they would like to serve again, and to position the team to start work on the second phase of the redesign.

GALILEO Redesign

The GALILEO redesign launched July 21. Feedback was generally positive about the redesign, including the look and feel of the interface, but there were some suggestions regarding creating an A-Z list of the databases, functionality of the search, and placement of icons and content areas on the home page.

The team is looking at all the feedback for possible changes to GALILEO, including adding an A-Z facet in the database search area.

In addition, on the day of the launch, a change on the GALILEO department site created errors for GALILEO Search. This was noticed in the morning, and the team worked to rectify the problem. In the next redesign, it has been suggested to launch earlier in the morning to catch big snags before the general public wakes and begins using GALILEO Search.

The team is expected to begin conversation on the second phase of the redesign in August.

New Resources

New online records that describe the history of Peachtree City, Georgia, one of the country's most successful post-World War II "new towns," are now available for researchers in the Digital Library of Georgia. The collection, Peachtree City: Plans, Politics, and People, "New Town" Beginnings and How the "New Town" Grew, is available at dlg.usg.edu/collection/frrls-pt_newtown and contains prospectuses, master plans, maps, conceptual drawings, newsletters, and administrative records dating from the 1950s to 2007.

Subgrants

To broaden partner participation in the Digital Library of Georgia (DLG), DLG is soliciting proposals for historic digitization projects costing up to \$7500 in DLG services from non-profit Georgia cultural



heritage institutions. Applicant organizations must be open to the public, and their collections must be available for public research either by appointment or through regular hours. The deadline for this grant program is Oct. 1, 2020.
