# **GALILEO Support Services**

## **OpenAthens**

GALILEO OpenAthens implementations continued this year. The support team took a pause to resolve technical issues with our existing proxy servers. Since June, we have completed 5 OpenAthens implementations, including our first implementation for a public library system in Georgia, Live Oak. Support has completed extensive planning for our PINES public library systems, and the project to complete those implementations will begin at full speed in the coming days.

We have started to engage with GaDOE again around a specific portal project involving Single Sign On. This is an opportunity to begin the larger and more complex work of the K-12 OpenAthens implementations.

# **GALILEO Redesign**

GALILEO launched the second phase of the portal redesign on July 19. We've also conducted training on the changes for K-12, public and academic libraries. In December, we planned to make the bento search the default. The GALILEO Development Advisory Group will not meet in August.

# Affordable Learning Georgia

### Affordable Materials Grants

#### Accessibility

ALG has released its new <u>OER Accessibility Evaluation Rubric</u>. It includes a digital rubric hosted in Google Forms with a spreadsheet for records, a fill-and-printable rubric for offline use, and an optional shared spreadsheet on which users can share their evaluations openly. The rubric is hosted on ALG's accessibility page along with all other accessibility resources.

### OpenALG

ALG continues to release new open educational resources on its new repository site, <u>OpenALG</u>. New resources include open textbooks, ancillary materials, and adoption grant materials, among other resources. A few of the recent additions include:

# **Digital Library of Georgia**

#### DPLA

The DLG has 795,885 records in DPLA currently and is the 10<sup>th</sup> largest contributor of records. DPLA will re-harvest our records in September.

#### Subgrant recipients announced

Eight institutions (and nine projects) are recipients of the ninth set of service grants awarded in a program intended to broaden partner participation in the DLG and engage with diverse institutions across the state of Georgia. The DLG solicited proposals for historic digitization projects in a statewide call, and applicants submitted proposals for projects with a cost of up to \$7,500.00. In addition, DLG staff will provide free digitization, metadata, and hosting services so that users can find more of Georgia's diverse history online for free. This subgranting program was presented the 2018 Award for Excellence in Archival Program Development by a State Institution by the Georgia Historical Records Advisory Council (GHRAC).

- University of Georgia Alexander Campbell King Law Library Archives & Special Collections (Athens, Ga.) -- Photographs taken by the University of Georgia School of Law's staff, including its Communications and Public Relations Department, or by photographers hired to capture prominent event speakers encompassing fifty years of legal and political history.
- Atlanta History Center (Atlanta, Ga.) -- 149 oral history interviews conducted by Georgia State University students between 1969 and 1970 with rural Georgians and Southeasterners from rural and often isolated areas, where little documentation survives
- Columbia Theological Seminary (Decatur, Ga.) -- Lexington Presbyterian Church (Lexington, Ga.) records, 1822-1916 and the Henry Newton papers, 1842-1900.
- Mercer University Archives and Special Collections (Macon, Ga.) -- Mission Messenger (1895-1921), published by the Women's Baptist Missionary Union of Georgia.
- National Museum of the Mighty Eighth Air Force (Pooler, Ga.) -- Materials that focus on the activity at Savannah Army Air Base (Hunter Field), Savannah, Georgia, to prepare the Eighth Air Force for combat following its activation on January 28, 1942.
- **Pitts Theology Library (Decatur, Ga.)** -- **B**ound conference journals dating from 1867 to 1939, produced by the Methodist Episcopal Church (MEC), a Northern church that established missions in Georgia during the Reconstruction Era.
- Friends of the Rylander Theatre (Americus, Ga.) -- Materials belonging to the Rylander Theatre that document downtown Americus, Georgia, and the role of the local theater in the rural south spanning from 1921-1957, including items related to the Rylander Theatre's "first life" before it went dark for 40 years in 1951.
