GALILEO Support Activities

OpenAthens

- The GALILEO Support Services team activated OpenAthens for Point University and Shorter University.
- Preparation is underway to bring Berry College and Richmond Graduate University live in early December.
- The UGA and UGA Law OpenAthens is on track to go live during the winter break, with processes beginning on or around December 21.

GALILEO Development Advisory Committee (GDAC)

On Oct. 27, GDAC held a meeting updating committee members on a survey to gain their insight on features for Phase 2. These included integration of widgets, such as LibGuides, into GALILEO; glossary of key library terms; translated version of GALILEO into various other languages, especially Spanish; additional refinement of categories; core collection of homeschool resources; and user customizations. The next GDAC meeting is planned for Nov. 23.

Ongoing weekly meetings continue updating the progress of new and future changes. GALILEO staff will meet December 16 to prepare a detailed project plan for phase II of the redesign.

Affordable Materials Grants: Round 18 Awardees

The round 18 request for proposals offered grant awards to support adoption, adaptation, and creation of no- or low-cost learning materials in USG courses, as well as continuous improvement of those materials. The grants had two categories: Transformation Grants (for courses adopting no- or low-cost materials for the first time), and Continuous Improvement Grants (for courses improving materials and/or improving their use of the materials).

ALG worked with a team of experienced grant reviewers who evaluated the projects and managed the peer review process using Google Forms. Proposing teams were notified of the review committee's decision after an administrative review.

In this round, 33 proposals were received. Of these, 98 proposals from 15 USG institutions were awarded grants.

Subgrants

Proposals for subgrants of services for historic digitization projects costing up to \$7500 in DLG services from nonprofit [Georgia](#) cultural heritage institutions were due Oct. 1, 2020. Thirteen institutions applied for the program for this round. The review panel met Nov. 4 and selected nine organizations for full or partial awards. Four awardees are organizations new to the DLG partner community.

ArchivesSpace

DLG is hosting ArchivesSpace, an archival management system, for five Georgia organizations for cost recovery. The fee is \$1500 per fiscal year. We will begin onboarding the next cohort of implementers for
