GALILEO Activities Report – Sept. 2021 to Oct. 2021

GALILEO Strategic Plan

GALILEO has several long-term goals outlined in its strategic plan (on the website at this link).

GALILEO Support Services

OpenAthens

Most higher education institutions have made the transition, and GALILEO is now focused on Georgia public libraries. There are 62 library systems across all 159 counties. Over the summer, staff completed the first public library implementation at Live Oak Public Libraries. Since then, the team has complete implementation for Athens Regional Library System, Piedmont Regional Library System and Dougherty County Library System.

All public library changes are expected to wrap up by spring 2022.

Next in the queue are K-12 schools. With more than 2000 public schools in the state this will be the largest—and most complex—transition to single sign-on authentication. However, our team has already started talks with the Georgia Department of Education on how to implement the changes. No timeline yet for K-12.

GALILEO Redesign

GALILEO developers expect to launch the next major design on Dec. 20. It will include making the new bento functionality the default, improving the "journals" bento search, and adding bento boxes for other resources, such as New Georgia Encyclopedia. We are also planning to implement usability changes to the wayfinder page. The ability for institutions to customize the bento boxes that appear is on the horizon.

Digital Library of Georgia

DPLA

The DLG has 812,300 records in DPLA currently, and it continues to be one of the top contributors. DPLA will re-harvest DLG records in December.

New Resources

In partnership with the Georgia State University Special Collections and Archives (music and broadcasting collections), DLG has digitized 24 scrapbooks from the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Collection dating from 1945-1985. They are now available online as part of the <u>Atlanta Symphony</u> <u>Orchestra Collection</u>.

This work was done as part of a competitive digitization grant intended to broaden partner participation in the DLG and provide digitization services costing up to \$7500 for historic collections from nonprofit Georgia cultural heritage institutions.
