## LegalForms Library (Gale)



Useful for filing patents and trademarks, developing leases, creating bills of sale, delegating power of attorney, name changes, and hundreds of other legal tasks, the forms in this resource were drafted by attorneys as opposed to generic forms found in a basic internet search.

In addition to forms, you will find a legal Q&A section, an attorney directory, tax forms, and a law digest reference for identifying points of law from reported cases.

## Ancestry Library Edition and HeritageQuest Online



Premium genealogy resources run the gamut from getting started on a family tree project to extensive genealogical research. Ancestry Library Edition is the public library offering of the popular Ancestry.com. Because of agreements with Ancestry.com, the public library edition is only available within the library.

HeritageQuest Online, while not as extensive as Ancestry, provides many of the fundamental resources of genealogical research and is available from home.

Steps to access resources:

1. Log into PINES, then click on GALILEO OR get your GALILEO password from your library.
2. Click on "All Databases" and browse to the resource by name.

The Discover search box you see on the GALILEO home page allows you to search thousands of journals, magazines, and ebooks. Articles found in this search have all been through the editorial process for publication.
