

# **DLG Quick Facts**

Based at the University of Georgia Libraries, the <u>Digital Library of Georgia</u> is a <u>GALILEO</u> initiative that collaborates with Georgia's institutions of education and culture to provide access to key information resources on Georgia history, culture, and life. This primary mission is accomplished through the ongoing development, maintenance, and preservation of digital collections and online digital library resources including the <u>Digital Library of Georgia</u>, <u>Civil Rights Digital Library</u>, <u>Georgia Historic Newspapers</u>, and <u>Civil War in the American South</u>. DLG also serves as Georgia's service hub for the <u>Digital Public Library of America</u>.

### **DLG Newspaper Milestones**

In 2007, the Digital Library released its first newspaper website, the Red and Black Archive.

The DLG began releasing regional newspaper sites in 2011, beginning with the South Georgia Historic Newspapers Archive.

The DLG reached the half million pages digitized milestone in October 2012.

The National Endowment for the Humanities awarded the Digital Library of Georgia a two-year National Digital Newspaper Program grant to digitize 100,000 more pages of Georgia historic newspapers in August 2017. In August 2019, DLG was awarded a second round of funding to digitize an additional 110,000 pages of historic newspapers.
