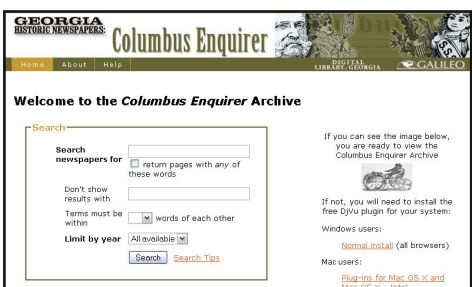

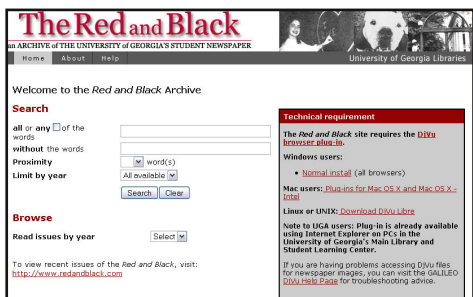

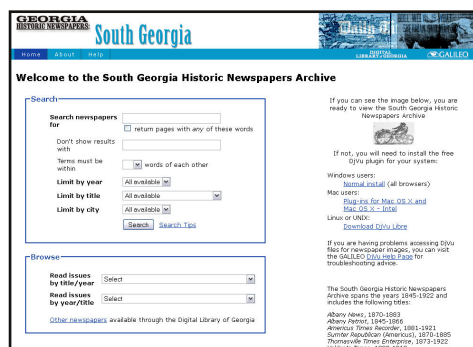

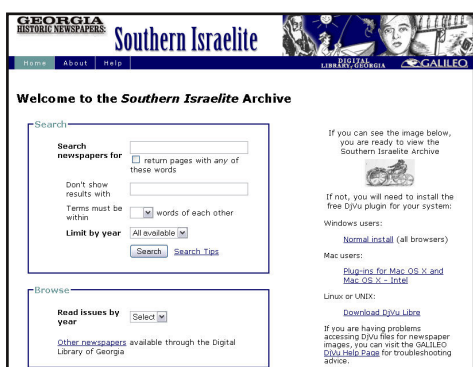

Southern Israelite Archive spans the years 1929-1986 from its beginning as a temple bulletin in Augusta in 1925 to its expansion into a monthly and then weekly newspaper. The paper not only covered the news of the southern Jewry, including the 1958 Temple bombing in Atlanta, but also the issues that involved Jewish populations throughout the nation and world.
