Inclusive Access

Lucy is working the USG on trying to get changes made to the USG Inclusive Access Policy. Once the policy changes are made would like to negotiate statewide pricing.

Inclusive access is a model of textbook and courseware access. It is sometimes called day one initiatives, typically digital content may be bundled with courseware, test prep, homework, platforms. Think like my Math Lab. A number of USG institutions are currently doing it. A number of private higher ed institutions doing it as well. There is a bit of a disconnect between what the USG policy and business process manual says. Technically this is not opt out access. Which is where students are opted in and have to opt out. Not currently allowed even though institutions are doing it. Working through various folks at the system office to get the alignment in policy in place. If you are familiar with OHIO Link they put this model in place and managed to save money across the state.

ILS RFP Update

Mostly of interest to the USG folks on the call could have implications for others as well. Currently in negotiation phase. We had a Planning phase January-March/April 2022, Posting phase May-July 2022, Evaluation Phase July-October 2022 and Negotiation phase (November 2022-February 2023)

Evaluation team reviewed responses from four vendors. Three vendors were invited to demo. Several hundred people attended demos; 80+ provided survey feedback

 - Pre-Negotiation meetings scheduled 12/5
 - Full negotiation meetings in January
- Still a lot of details and concerns to be worked out
 - Negotiation team Jeff Steely (Georgia State), Sonya Gaither (Clayton State), Lucy Harrison, Barry Robinson Sean Boyle and Lucy Harrison.
 - Pricing is a major issue with at least one vendor
 - Development capabilities/timeline
 - Working through technical requirements to identify integration/system/architecture "gaps"
- Still eyeing a February/March decision but that is flexible

Potential Impact on Non USG Libraries

- If Ex Libris selected the negotiation, initial impact to USG and TCSG (mostly pricing)
- Any move away from current vendor could affect TCSG
- Will also talk with private higher eds to determine interest
- Conversations with GPLS around resource sharing

Member Updates

Julie Walker (GPLS) wrapped up month of nominations for GPLS Awards. GPLS Awards are given annually or the Public Library of the Year, Public Library Director of the Year, Library

Employee of the Year and Library Champion. Nominations were open for the month of November. Announcements will be made in January. Celebrate them on Library Day at the Capital. The Governor joins to help present awards. Next week is the public library director's meeting. There are three a year. Next week will be in Savannah. New public director orientation. Several new public library directors. So, we will spend a day with them. There will be a new public library e-resources advisory committee to evaluate experience with e-read kids and explore other options for participation in the Palace Project in January.

Martha Powers-Jones (Okefenokee) mentioned that Julie left out a key piece of information that she was honored by. Julie Walker is the president of COSAL. (Chief Officers of State Library Agencies). Julie served as Vice Chair for a few years.

Donita Hinckley (K-12 Georgia Department of Education) big 3 year project called Georgia Connects technology ecosystem that will encompass lots of different systems pulling them all together to provide one place for educators to access Georgia Learns (professional learning), SuitCASE (standards for all courses in public education in Georgia), Inspire (instructional resource portal, newest part). Teachers can add their own lessons. An enhancement will be able to share lessons with administrators, fellow teachers. Media specialist can create lessons also and share with teachers.

Allison Repzynski (TCSG) enrolling all adult education students in student information system. Students will have ID numbers and access GALILEO resources from home.
