Pre-CINAHL Removed from GALILEO Menus for Some Institutions

On Friday, November 17th, EBSCO's Pre-CINAHL will be removed from GALILEO menus for all institutions who subscribe to CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text, and CINAHL Plus with Full Text through GALILEO. For these institutions, Pre-CINAHL content has been integrated into the respective CINAHL database that your institution subscribes to. Pre-CINAHL will remain on the GALILEO menus for institutions who subscribe to CINAHL only.

For those affected by this change, all active EBSCO Search Alerts that have been configured in Pre-CINAHL will expire when Pre-CINAHL is removed by EBSCO at the end of November. You will need to re-establish your alerts within CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text, or CINAHL Plus with Full Text. Also, any GALILEO Express Links that you have configured to Pre-CINAHL will become inactive on November 17th. The Express Link URL is:

We are pleased to announce that Pre-CINAHL content has been successfully integrated into the CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text, and CINAHL Plus with Full Text products. As a result, we will be removing Pre-CINAHL as a separate database for those customers who subscribe to CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text, and CINAHL Plus with Full Text, in an effort to limit end-user confusion when selecting a database to search. Your users will no longer see a separate listing for Pre-CINAHL on the Choose Databases screen in EBSCO/host,/ and will be able to simply access all of this content through one of the three above-referenced databases.

If you have links to Pre-CINAHL now, please remove them, as they will no longer function after the removal of Pre-CINAHL as a separate database. The integrity of the Pre-CINAHL content will remain intact, and will automatically be available to your users when they search CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text, or CINAHL Plus with Full Text.

In order to give you ample time to make any changes to links to Pre-CINAHL, we are holding off on the removal of Pre-CINAHL as a separate database until the end of November 2006. If you have active Search Alerts in Pre-CINAHL, they will expire

when the separate Pre-CINAHL database is removed.

Please note: If you subscribe to CINAHL only, and have a current trial for CINAHL Plus, CINAHL with Full Text or CINAHL Plus with Full Text, you will continue to have Pre-CINAHL provided as a separate database, with your CINAHL subscription. It is only those customers who subscribe to any of the three aforementioned products who will see the integration of Pre-CINAHL content and removal of it as a separate database.

The electronic journals list is powered by SFX with authentication support by EZproxy; it provides a searchable list of all electronic journals available to your institution via the databases managed on your behalf by GALILEO.

Please note:

\* Resources that are managed in the GALILEO Local Resource Integration system are not included at this time. In Phase II of the GALILEO upgrade, a process will be put in place to include local resources in the Find It electronic journals list.

The electronic journals list is powered by SFX with authentication support by EZproxy and provides a searchable list of all electronic journals available to your institution via GALILEO. Once the list is in production, linking among GALILEO resources will be implemented so that citations without full-text in one resource can link to full-text available in another.

Please note: \* It is very important that staff at each library review this new feature while it is still in the demonstration system in order to uncover any issues prior to moving into production, as changes are very difficult to make once that occurs. \* Existing SFX institutions (UGA, GSU, Georgia Tech, Emory, Agnes Scott, West Georgia, and MCG) have different arrangements in place. ### **New DLG Database: University of Georgia Centennial Alumni Catalog, 1901.**

The Digital Library of Georgia and the Hargrett Rare Books & Manuscripts Library are pleased to announce the availability of a new online resource: University of Georgia Centennial Alumni Catalog, 1901.

In 1901, to celebrate 100 years of classes at the Athens campus, the University of Georgia assembled the Centennial Alumni Catalog, containing, "as far as possible, a full but concise account of the life and services of all alumni during the century." Although the word "alumni" was used, the project attempted to collect biographical data about anyone who matriculated at the university during that first century, whether or not they graduated.

A four-page questionnaire was mailed to known matriculates or their families and an impressive 1,749 completed forms were returned. These were placed in alphabetical order, bound into several volumes, and deposited with the University Libraries. Eventually they came to be housed in the University Archives unit of the Hargrett Rare Books & Manuscripts Library at the University of Georgia Libraries, where they have proved to be a valuable resource to historians and genealogists. Included are biographies of many prominent men of 19th century Georgia and the South, sometimes written in their own hand.

In 2006 the fragile documents were removed from their bindings, at times revealing information long hidden beneath the stitching. The forms then were scanned and are presented online by the Digital Library of Georgia.

The questionnaires provide information on residence; nativity; collegiate activities and accomplishments; marriage; occupations; civic, military, religious, and other public service; writings; relatives who attended the University; and death date.

## **EBSCOhost Domain Name Change (summer 06)**

As some of you may already know, EBSCO is in the process of changing to a new domain that will affect the URL's used to access their products. This change will not affect your access to EBSCO databases through GALILEO or via GALILEO Express Links, as all of the links to EBSCO databases through GALILEO, including databases that are on their platforms other than EBSCOhost, have been updated.

However, if you currently maintain links to EBSCO databases through GALILEO Local Resource Integration (GLRI), you will need to update your URLs to reflect the change in domain name. Also, the URLs to any locally-purchased EBSCO databases that your library may have purchased outside of GALILEO will also need to be updated to the new domain.

EBSCO has not provided a definitive date when the change will be completed, but have indicated that they hope to have the change completed by the end of July or early August.

## **GALILEO additions and changes FY07**

There are several exciting changes to announce for this upcoming year including the addition of databases for public libraries, changes in the Kids Page, and the addition of new institutions.

The following 3 databases will be available to all public libraries beginning in early July:

1. Encyclopaedia Britannica Online Reference Center Public Library Edition (Available July 1 with access through Quick Search beta coming soon.)  
Encyclopaedia Britannica Online Reference Center includes four complete encyclopedias accessed through an interface designed specifically for a public library audience. (July 1)
2. Encyclopaedia Britannica for Kids Public Library Edition (Available July 1 with access through Quick Search beta coming soon.)  
Encyclopaedia Britannica for Kids includes both the Britannica Elementary Encyclopedia and Compton's by Britannica geared to middle school students behind an interface designed for the younger public library audience. (July 1)

### 3. HeritageQuest Online

HeritageQuest Online consists of digitized genealogy and local history resources from a collection of unique microfilmed materials for both genealogical hobbyists and professionals. Many of the digital images in this collection are not available to researchers anywhere else. The database also includes the complete U.S. federal census from 1790 through 1920. (Coming Soon!)

The following change has been made to the GALILEO Kids Page :

Kids Search has replaced Searchasaurus. Kids Search is EBSCO's newly designed interface for students in grades K through 5. This new interface replaces the Searchasaurus interface, which is no longer being updated by EBSCO. Kids Search provides elementary school students with an easy-to-use, graphically-appealing interface they can use to search their EBSCO databases. Kids Search will begin appearing on the GALILEO Kids Page on July 1st.

And last, but certainly not least, we are pleased to announce that several new institutions will be joining the GALILEO community, including a group of private K-12 schools through the Georgia Independent School Association and the Georgia Campus of the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine through the Georgia Private Academic Libraries consortium

SRC and Kids Search interfaces are searchable through the Advanced search screen.

### **Scopus trial for academic libraries**

Beginning tomorrow morning, Scopus will appear on the GALILEO menus for academic institutions who are participating in the Scopus trial. Scopus is an abstracts database of 27 million records covering articles from 14,000 peer-reviewed titles from more than 4,000 international publishers with access to abstracts in the scientific, medical, technical and social science arena. Trial access to this database will only be available to on-campus users.

Scopus will be available as a trial until March 2007; however, at the end of December 2006, libraries participating in the trial will be asked if they wish to subscribe for 2007. Libraries would be billed in July 2007 if they choose to subscribe. If the library does not choose to subscribe, trial access will terminate in March 2007.

## **EBSCOhost Enhancements Announced for Winter Release**

EBSCO has announced significant enhancements to the EBSCOhost interface for the Winter Release. Highlights of this release include subject clustering of results, a Visual Search mode, and a federated search by database groupings. Visual Search in particular represents a major difference in the user's experience, and we encourage everyone to take a look at it. Key features of the Winter EBSCOhost Release include:

- \* Visual Search delivers a graphical searching alternative powered by Grokker.
- \* Clustering displays links of search results sorted by subject, in addition to regular Result List article links.
- \* Database Groupings by Subject allows users to search groupings of databases sorted by subjects, such as technology, business, medical science, psychology or education. (Users can still search specific databases by using the Choose Databases tab.)
- \* Printing, Emailing and Saving in Standard Industry Formats allows researchers interested in citing articles using specific industry formats to choose from the following: AMA, APA, Chicago/Turabian: Humanities, Chicago/Turabian: Author-Date, Modern Language Association or Vancouver/ICMJE.
- \* RSS-enabled Alerts allow librarians and users to feed results from EBSCOhost Search and Journal Alerts into their news readers and aggregators, as well as their web sites.
- \* Context-specific Help is instantly available when users click on question mark icons.
